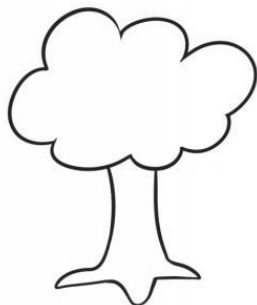

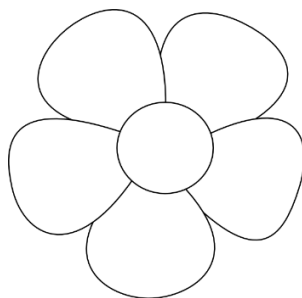

“Only one more day,” said Mother on Wednesday.

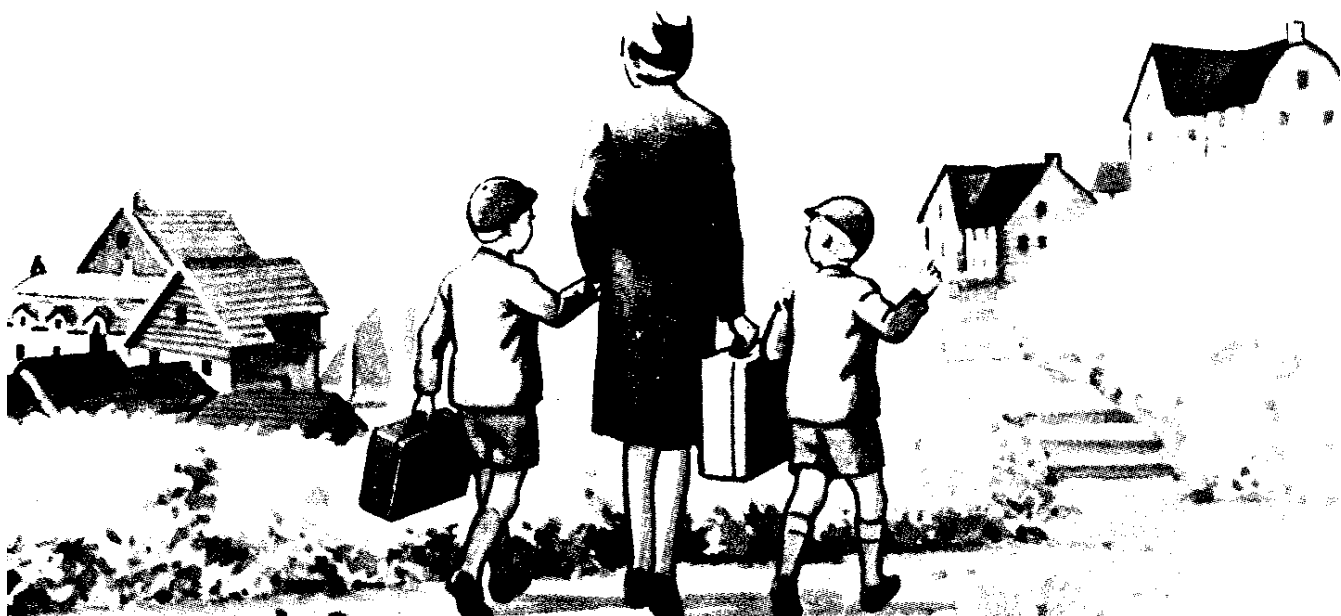
“It’s to-day,” they all said on Thursday.

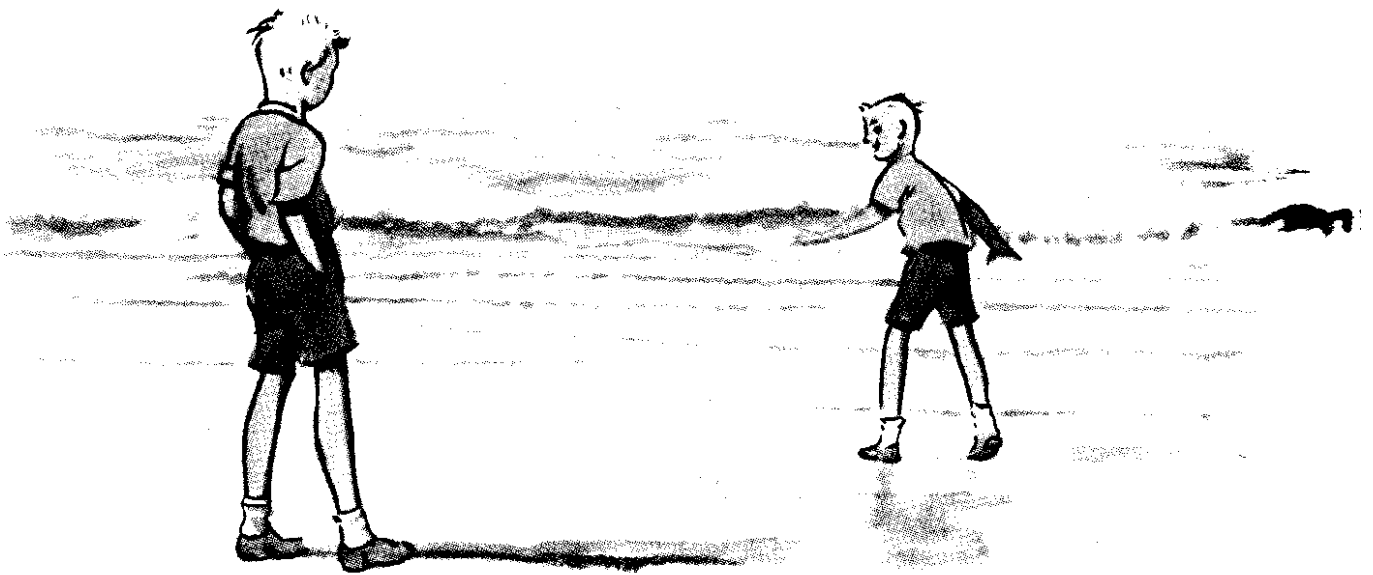
Yes, Thursday was the day when they said good-bye to the house with the blue
